TAKING THE LONG WAY, Dixie Chicks

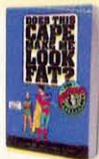

Now on DVD: season 2 of HBO's gritty frontier series. Its language and byzantine themes make for something truly unique: a baroque Western.

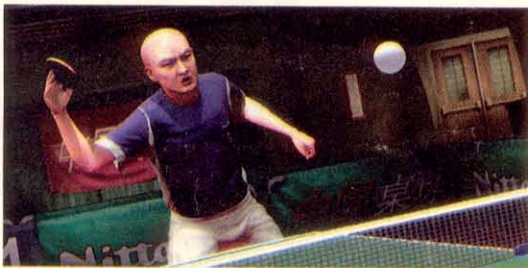
3. DOES THIS CAPE MAKE ME LOOK FAT?
